This interactive workshop will address practical strategies and legal requirements for an effective school and team response to bullying and discriminatory harassment under federal and state civil rights laws. Workshop participants will explore the educational, social and emotional assessments needed to remediate the harm suffered by students with disabilities. Participants will examine the legal requirements and practical strategies for adopting corrective measures. Participants will analyze case studies to learn how to effectively utilize resources in developing individual and school-wide responses to bullying and harassment.

Participants will:

- Learn strategies for an effective response to bullying and harassment.
- Identify strategies for protecting students who are vulnerable to bullying or harassment.
- Practice making effective individualized assessments of students with disabilities who are victims or perpetrators of harassment or bullying to prevent victimization.
- Learn the design and implementation of effective whole-school approaches.
