This Workshop will examine proven, practical strategies for promoting equity, social inclusion and positive race and ethnic relations in diverse schools and schools with increasing numbers of students of color, or children from emerging immigrant communities. It will also explore the common mistakes and systemic barriers in schools that contribute to intergroup tensions and conflicts. The workshop will also address new and emerging civil rights and diversity-related challenges in schools in the current political climate. It will also review the legal requirements and practical steps needed to effectively prevent and respond to racial and ethnicity-based discrimination and harassment, including based on students actual or perceived immigration status.
